# EICR CHECKLIST ARE YOU READY?

#### **Before You Book**

Use this checklist to prepare your property and avoid delays.

- Property has a working main fuse board/consumer unit
- All rooms and circuits are accessible (no locked areas)
- No major building work is ongoing
- Provide details of any recent electrical work or alterations
- Provide details of any previous electrical testing documents
- If you're managing multiple properties, ensure you have:
- Full address
- Tenant access details
- Site contact (if not attending yourself)

#### What Will Be Checked?

An electrician will inspect and test the following to ensure the installation is safe for continual use:

- Main fuse board/consumer unit
- Protective devices (RCBOs, RCDs, MCBs)
- Earthing and bonding (gas, water pipes)
- Socket outlets and switches
- Lighting circuits (including outside lights if connected)
- Fixed wiring condition (cables, terminations)
- Presence of appropriate warning labels and notices
- Condition of accessories (damage, overheating, wear)
- Circuit loading and identification
- Compliance with BS 7671 wiring regulations
- Presence of surge protection (if required)
- Smoke alarm test (if hardwired and relevant)





#### What to Expect on the Day

- Inspection usually takes **2–4 hours** for domestic properties
- Temporary power loss is normal during testing
- Your electrician may need to remove socket/switch covers
- Tenant will be advised prior to brief power disruptions
- Results may be discussed on-site or sent in writing
